

THE PASDEL PROJECT

In July 2006 European Commission has selected PASDEL Project for being funded by the Leonardo da Vinci Programme, in which CIFAL Płock and Municipality of Płock participate as partners. Only 18 projects have been selected out of 54 pre selected in October 2005.

PASDEL (PrActicing Sustainable Development through E-Learning) aims to improve the professional training offer in a field of the sustainable development for cities/organizations/enterprises. The project is an answer to the need of transversal qualifications of local deciders: representatives of local authorities, the enterprises, institutions executives and technicians, who could not find relevant, multidisciplinary training offer for their employees.

The PASDEL Project will develop of e-modules, practical, complete and adaptable to the context of each European country. The tool will be accessible for each person who will like to complete or to specialize her qualification. Use of the newest technology and the Internet as a main tool of learning proposes a wide access to the greatest number of people

Płock is the only Polish city taking part in PASDEL Project. The leading partner is ADDH (Academy of Sustainable and Human Development) based in France. Płock institutions involved into the Project are: CIFAL Płock and Płock City Hall. The other partners are: the University of Iasi in Romania, the Eco – Council Institute of Namur in Belgium and of Galati in Romania, the University of Charles V of Prague in the Chech Republic.

Together those partners will produce innovative and adapted educational tools on the sustainable development, from the High Environmental Quality to the biodiversity, to energy efficiency and to renewable energies, or still to transport, water and waste.

CIFAL Płock - International Training Centre for Local Authorities/Actors in Central and Eastern Europe will manage the realization of the Project in Poland. CIFAL Płock will be responsible for coordinating of training programmes translations from French into Polish. Translation will be done by Paweł Włodkowiec University College. Płock Centre will be also responsible for promotion of the Project in Poland and for creation of data base of interested institutions. According to the preliminary budget, Polish partners will receive around 100 000 Euro for conducting the PASDEL project in the next two years. Total cost of the project amounts to 519.079,50 Euro, the donation from the EU will cover 70,28% of total expenditures which makes 364 824,50 Euro.
